

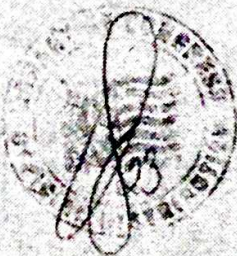

Gutenberg's introduction of movable type in 1454 stands as one of the most momentous events in human history. It invigorated the Renaissance's humanist movement which came to challenge traditional beliefs and cultivated the dissentious climate from which Martin Luther defied the Catholic Church. Focusing on materials from the Rosenwald Collection, the talk will trace the key figures and innovations which fomented the Reformations in France and Germany. Finally common misconceptions surrounding these events will be discussed.
