CATHOLIC SYMBOLS "THREATEN" JEWS?

Don Gross, a staff writer for the Staten Island Advance, wrote a news story on February 16 on how St. Vincent's Medical Center goes out of its way to accommodate Jewish patients. But in his story, Gross said that a Jewish social worker is employed by the Catholic hospital "to ease the minds of Jewish patients who suddenly find themselves surrounded by the trappings of the Catholic Church-objects that can be strange and even threatening-during a time of extreme stress."

The league offered the following response:

"It would be instructive to know what Catholic objects are found `threatening' by most Jews. To insinuate that Jews are threatened by Catholic imagery suggests either a culpabiliity on the part of Catholics or a hypersensitivity on the part of Jews. Which is it, Mr. Gross?"
