PBS: MODEL OF BIAS

PBS has a long track record of biased reporting, so there is no news in reporting that in a show on homosexuality and the Catholic Church, the Church came off badly. "In the Life-Don't Ask, Don't Tell," which was broadcast in New York on December 20, concentrated on the struggle that gays and lesbians face on Catholic campuses.
