Dear Mr. Salyer:

I read with interest your decision, based on the advice of school district attorneys, to censor "A Charlie Brown Christmas" from one of your elementary schools; other schools in your district have also been asked to remove all religious references from their upcoming Christmas productions.

Your message on the district's website says you made this decision "in accordance with federal laws." In fact, there is nothing in federal law that mandates this censorial approach. While the U.S. Supreme Court has not ruled definitively on this subject, it let stand a 1980 decision by the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit that conditionally allowed for Christmas assemblies with religious themes (See *Florey v. Sioux Falls*; it is enclosed). Pursuant to this ruling, the Sioux Falls School District allowed Christmas performances of a religious nature to be performed provided they were presented "in a prudent and objective manner and as a traditional part of the cultural and religious heritage of the particular holiday." To this day, *Florey* remains the controlling ruling on this subject, thus paving the way for you to allow these Christmas events.

Please reconsider your decision.
