Dear Mayor Taylor:

As president of the nation's largest Catholic civil rights organization, I implore you to work out a compromise with residents of Highlands who would like to restore the cross atop the town Christmas tree. I understand your concern for safety: there have been cases in the past where high winds blew off the ornament (a star) that sat on the top of the tree. But there are alternatives that would satisfy those who want to honor the religious meaning of Christmas while also honoring the need for safety.

Why not surround the base of the Christmas tree with small crosses? Or place religious ornaments (e.g., angels or nativity scenes) on the tree?

The U.S. Supreme Court, in *Lynch v. Donnelly* (1984), held that religious symbols could adorn a town park at Christmastime as long as they were accompanied by secular symbols. In this case, it would actually be the reverse: religious symbols (crosses or religious ornaments) would accompany a secular symbol (the tree). Most important, the high court said that the Constitution "affirmatively mandates accommodation, not merely tolerance of all religions, and forbids hostility toward any."
